RIVERSIDE CITY COUNCIL MEETING: November 6, 2017

Work Session was held at 5:30 pm to review the Washington County Multi-Jurisdictional Hazard Mitigation Plan.

The Riverside City Council meeting opened at 6:33 pm in City Hall with Mayor Allen Schneider requesting roll call. Council members present were: Bob Schneider Jr., Tom Sexton, Ralph Schnoebelen, and Jeanine Redlinger. Rob Weber was absent.

Motion by Schnoebelen to approve the agenda. Second by Redlinger, passed 4-0.

Schneider moved to approve the minutes from October 16th, expenditures, and Casey's liquor permit. Second by Schnoebelen, passed 4-0.

Mayor Schneider opened the Public Hearing for the Sale of the Community Building at 81 E 1st Street to John Sojka at 6:39 pm. There were no written or oral comments from the audience. Glen Meisner, of MMS reminded Council that the water drainage from this building, and the adjoining building, drain under the building to the street on the south. Sojka was aware of drainage and will not disturb it. Sojka asked that the City try to divert additional water from the north, as they re-route the alley. Mayor closed Public Hearing at 6:48pm.

Schneider moved to pass Resolution #110617-01 Sale of Community Building at 81 E 1st Street to John Sojka for amount not to exceed \$33,400.00, subject to agreement that purchaser not disturb existing water drainage. Second by Sexton, passed 4-0.

Curtis Sexton, RVFD discussed concrete and lighting repairs at the fire station.

Redlinger moved to approve concrete repair at a cost not to exceed \$4200.00. Second by Schnoebelen, passed 4-0.

Bill Steig, RACE Enterprises, addressed council about his water bills at the car wash. Steig purchased car wash in 2006. Water rates were set up incorrectly when car wash was built in 2005. Decimal point was off one place, thus billing water at 1/10th of actual usage. Attorney Sueppel stated that Iowa Law allows for municipalities to adjust bills back for two years. Total under billed for past two years is \$26,647.12. Council would agree to a payment plan, with all payments made by June 30, 2018. Steig stated that he would be contacting his Attorney.

Rob Weber arrived at 7:10 pm.

Amy Schulte, Washington Y, gave final report for Camp Highland. Total summer attendance was 32, with 23 campers from Highland. City of Riverside contributes \$10,000.00 to the program.

Resolution #110617-05, Proceed with Arrangement for Northern Development, tabled until next meeting, as Jeff Edberg was unable to attend.

Glen Meisner, MMS Consultants presented closing comments on the 2nd Street and Washburn Street Project.

Schnoebelen moved to pass Resolution #110617-02 Final Pay Request #7 to Dave Schmidt Construction for \$13,115.17. Second by Redlinger, passed 5-0.

Council received final draft of the 28e Agreement with Washington County for the W61 Road Improvement Project.

Sexton moved to pass Resolution #110617-03 Washington County 28e Agreement for W61 Project, subject to removal of rumble strips from River Street to the bridge. Second by Schnoebelen, passed 5-0.

Meisner explained the tree agreement from Ella Street Project with Eric Byers to the Council. Schnoebelen moved to pay Byers \$600.00 for the 3 trees per signed agreement. Second by Redlinger, passed 5-0.

Schnoebelen moved to enter into Closed Session at 8:03 pm pursuant to Iowa Code 21.5(1)(j) to discuss potential real estate transaction. Second by Sexton, passed 5-0. Sexton moved to return to Open Meeting at 8:34 pm. Second by Weber, passed 5-0.

Sexton moved to have Mayor Schneider proceed as discussed. Second by Redlinger, passed 5-0.

Meisner reported that Iowa DOT has agreed to provide \$800,000.00 towards the Hwy 22 Resurfacing Project through the City of Riverside. Funds will be paid as soon as bids are awarded.

Redlinger moved to pass Resolution #110617-04 Engineering Contract for HWY 22 Resurfacing Project. Second by Schneider, passed 5-0.

Council has set a work session for Monday, November 13th for Northern Development, raised sidewalks, and Capital Projects payment schedule.

Schneider moved to pass Resolution #110617-06 Engineering Contract for the West Elementary Extension Street. Second by Sexton, passed 5-0.

Schneider moved to pass Resolution #110617-07 Certify Debt to County Treasurer – Russell Popham. Second by Redlinger, passed 4-1 Weber opposed.

Resolution #110617-08 was Tabled, requesting itemized bill from Kalonial Lawn Care.

Schneider moved to pass Resolution #110617-09 WCRF Municipal Grant Application for Quarterly Payments. Second by Schnoebelen, passed 5-0.

Schneider moved to purchase soft cab and broom repair from Schnoebelen Inc. for \$2503.00. Second by Redlinger, passed 3-1, Weber opposed, Schnoebelen abstained.

Sexton will get terms of agreement from Walkers for Welcome Sign. Schnoebelen will look into cleanup of damaged sign.

Schneider moved to pass Resolution #110617-10 Easement Agreement with Riverside Casino and Golf Resort for access to Well #8. Second by Sexton, passed 5-0.

Sexton moved to hire Warren McKenna as a Solar Energy Consultant at a fee of \$6000.00. Second by Weber, passed 4-1 Schnoebelen opposed.

Sledheads will be trimming the trees on the trail this Saturday at 8 am. Trail will be closed.

City Hall will be closed Friday, November 10th in observance of Veteran's Day.


Veteran's Day will be Saturday, November 11th at 10 am in Vets Memorial Park.

Schnoebelen moved to adjourn at 10:09 pm. Second by Redlinger, passed 5-0.

URBAN RENEWAL PLAN AMENDMENT
RIVERSIDE URBAN RENEWAL AREA

November, 2017

The Urban Renewal Plan (the "Plan") for the Riverside Urban Renewal Area (the "Urban Renewal Area") is being amended for the purposes of adding certain property to the Urban Renewal Area and identifying a new urban renewal project to be undertaken therein.

1) Addition of Property. The real property (the "Property") legally described on Exhibit A hereto is, by virtue of this Amendment, being added as the November, 2017 Addition to the Urban Renewal Area. With the adoption of this Amendment, the City will designate the Property as an economic development area. The Property will become subject to the provisions of the Plan for the Urban Renewal Area. It is anticipated that the City will adopt an ordinance providing for the division of property tax revenues, as set forth in Section 403.19 of the Code of Iowa, with respect to the Property.

2) Identification of Project. By virtue of this amendment, the list of authorized urban renewal projects in the Plan is hereby amended to include the following project description:

Name of Project: AFCS Truck Wash Development Project

Name of Urban Renewal Area: Riverside Urban Renewal Area

Date of Council Approval of the Project: November 20, 2017

Description of the Project and Project Location: Michael Vaughn (the "Developer") has proposed to undertake the construction of new facilities (the "Project") on certain real property (as described in Section 1 hereof) for use in the business operations of AFCS Truck Wash in the Urban Renewal Area.

It has been requested that the City provide tax increment financing assistance to the Developer in support of the efforts to complete, operate and maintain the Project.

The Parties hereby agree, subject to the approval of the Riverside City Council, to perform the following in an expeditious manner regarding this project:

1. Yeggy Roetlin Farms, LLC and Apex Construction have entered into a purchase and sale agreement for the sale of the Property from Seller to Buyer subject to the annexation of the Property into the City, execution of a Development Agreement and installation of the improvements as stated on the "North Growth Area Potential Project" chart provided by MMS Consultants, Inc.
2. The City of Riverside will review and consider approval of the annexation request and review and consider approval of the rezoning request, preliminary plat, plan of improvements and final plat in accordance with the Code of Iowa and the City Code of Riverside, Iowa for the subdivision of the Property. Said approvals will not be unreasonably withheld.
3. The City agrees to enter into a Development Agreement with the Buyer to identify the services to be provided as stated herein.
4. The City of Riverside agrees to extend sanitary sewer to the edge of the Property, to improve Tupelo Boulevard to acceptable City standards from where the current paving ends to the south of the Property to the southern entrance to the Property as shown on the attached "North Growth Area Potential Projects" prepared by MMS Consultants, Inc. The City agrees to be responsible for for the construction costs for the first 12 lots of the Property as shown on the attached "North Growth Area Potential Projects" prepared by MMS Consultants, Inc. for the following public improvements (Improvements):
 - a) Sanitary Sewer, including manholes and sanitary sewer service to each lot
 - b) Water Main, including valve and fire hydrants as required and water service to each lot
 - c) PCC paving with integral curb and gutter
 - d) Storm sewer intakes and piping as required, within the public right-of-way
 - e) Granular base material under paving
 - f) Longitudinal Subdrains as required
 - g) Grading for streets and street subgrade preparation
 - h) Storm Water Management Facilities, including outlet structures and storm sewer outside of public right-of-way
 - i) Erosion control and seeding of right-of way areas and storm water management areas

The following public improvements may also be required for approval of the final plat but will not be reimbursed by the City:

Water Operation & Maintenance

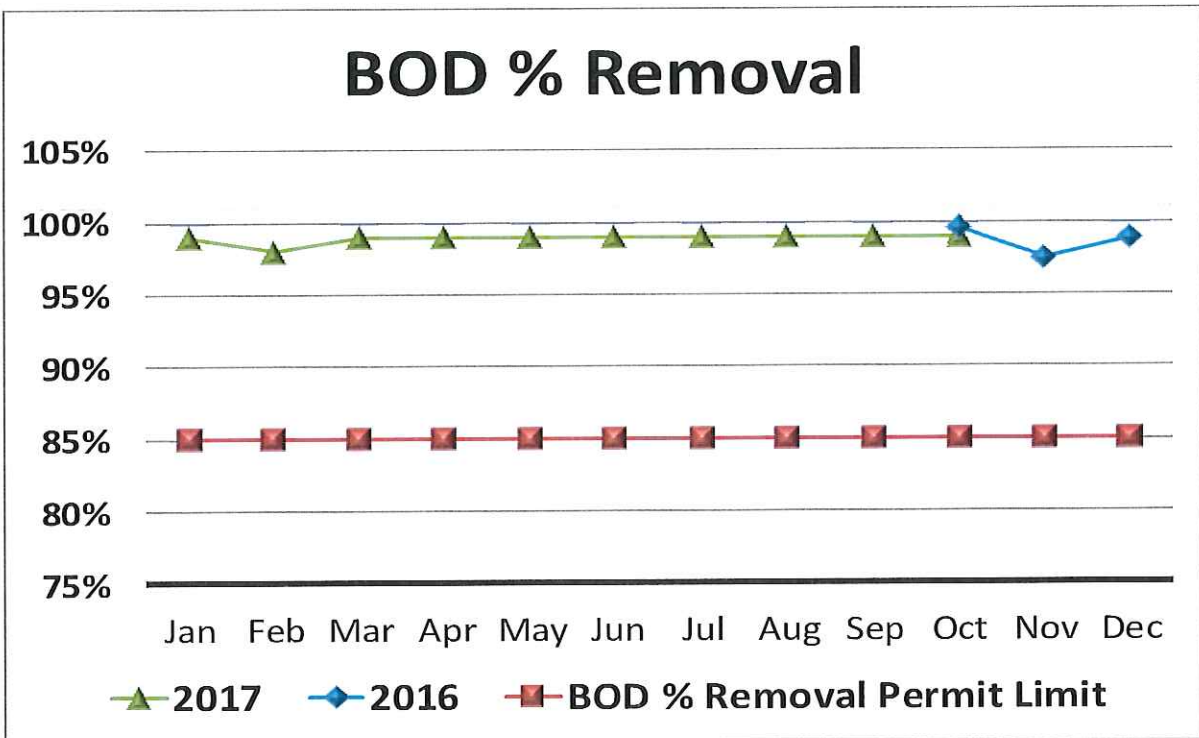
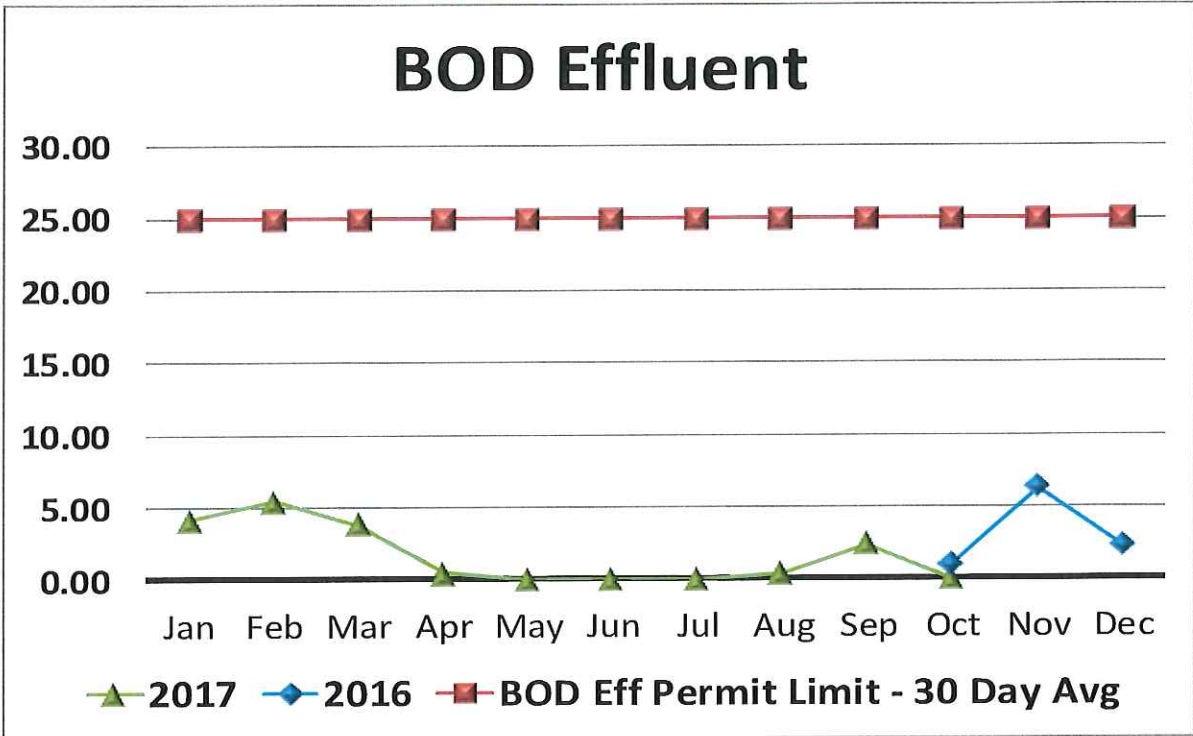
- Investigated high water usage bill at 121 Buckeye. An onsite inspection was done to find the source of the high water usage. The result was a toilet in the basement was leaking. It was advised to the homeowner to have the inside of the toilet replaced.
- Investigated why Race Enterprise Car wash had a high-water usage bill. After an onsite inspection of the water meter and previous water bills, it was determined that the billing software had been set up incorrectly. The decimal was in the wrong spot causing the software to think the meter was using less water than it was.
- Ryan and I located the water mains along Highway 22 through town at the request of MMS Consultants. We found most of the water mains that run parallel to Highway 22 were not under the street paving. There are about two blocks between Greene St and Washington St that are still under the paving.
- Ryan and I completed our annual valve exercising for 2017. PeopleService Inc. purchased a receiver mounted valve exercise machine and we were able to complete approximately 90 valves in 1 ½ days with the unit. The remaining valves were done by hand as they were not accessible with the machine. All records for valve maintenance and exercising have been updated with sizing, number of turns, depth, and as-built drawings. We also found there were about 20 valves in the system with no record of them being there.
- Ryan and I changed bag filters on filter canisters 1 and 2 for preventative maintenance.
- Ryan and I finished painting all hydrants in town. PeopleService purchased a Wagner painter and we were able to paint over 60 hydrants in one day.



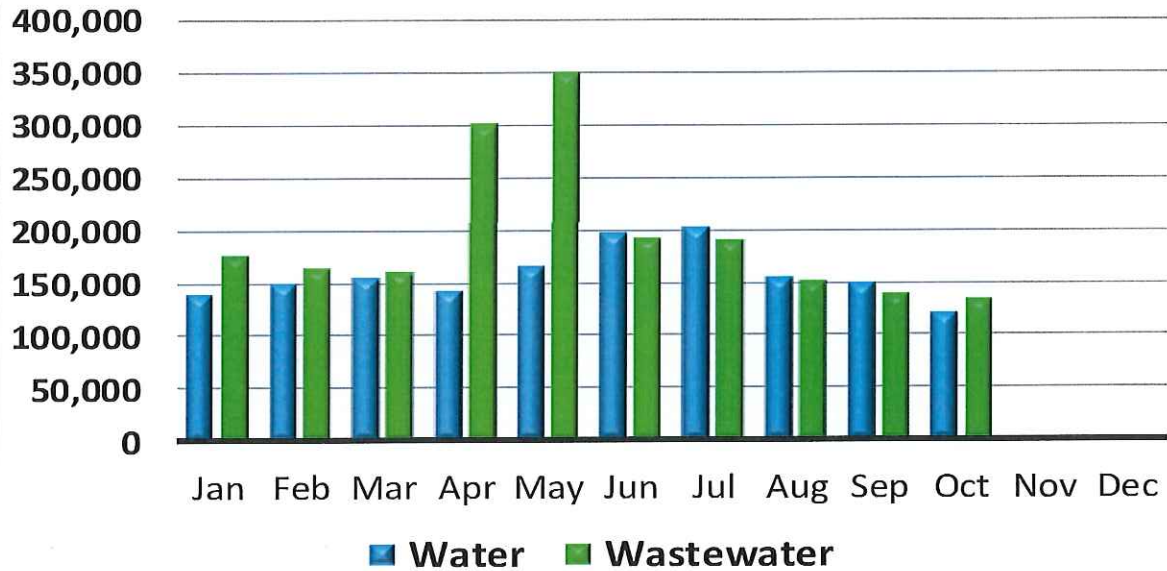
- Electric Pump installed an Omnisite alarm system at the water plant.
- Ryan and I completed 17 locates for the month of October.

Wastewater Operation & Maintenance

- While doing weekly generator exercising at lift station 1 I found the heater had failed and melted a hole through the housing and lost most of the coolant from the system. Most of the coolant was contained and cleaned up and disposed of. Josh and I installed a new heater and refilled coolant. Generator at lift station 1 is back in service.
- Lift station 5 received a high-level alarm from high flows at the casino. The casino was having a special event which created a surge into lift station 5. There was nothing to correct as all pumps were working properly.
- All Omnisites for the wastewater plant, lift station 1, 2 and 4 have been installed by Electric Pump and are operational.
